## **Learning Disability Transformation Team**



Seamless services for people with Learning Disabilities

#### North Wales Together: The Learning Disability Transformation Programme.

The project has been up and running since 2019 and its aim is to ensure that people with learning disabilities can lead a great life.

#### Community and Culture Change

Alternative Delivery Model (ADM) - Earlier in the summer grants were given to a number of community projects via a Citizen Panel, these panel members have received training and are now ready to follow up and provide quality checks on the progress being made.



We have started a new Voice & Control Project, we are planning to employ Voice Ambassadors who will be able to help train staff and who could also play a role in checking that people have a voice and are really involved in making decisions about their life. Also this month we held an event over zoom looking at plotting our path for the future, Fran O'Hara helped us capture people's views, it was an exciting morning with some great ideas.


North Wales Population Needs Assessment


#### North Wales Workforce Board
