Long-term Outcomes of the work:

- Agencies commit to working towards having a **mutual understanding, a shared vision** and a **common language**; this will entail a **culture change** and adopting new ways of working.
- Agencies develop **joint approaches** and mobilise new initiatives together **avoiding duplication and confusion**.
- There is **one coherent approach across agencies** to help support children, young people and families improve their emotional health, wellbeing and resilience
- Encourage the population **to help themselves first** by increasing access to information and knowledge about useful approaches and strategies
- **Use attachment, behavioural and cognitive theories** and **practice** to inform the design of activities and interventions that will help children and young people develop positive emotional health and wellbeing
- Develop **clear guidance** on **when it is appropriate to seek help and where from**

2 phase Research and Development Project with rapid timescales

Brief: Between November 2021 – March 2022

- to develop a bilingual digital platform that is fun and engaging
- For 8 – 11 year olds
- encompasses the framework
- Conduct a feasibility study and report with recommendations on how to roll out the full age range across the digital platform



Next Steps

- New programme structure developed to replace the previous Childrens Transformation Board and Childrens Integration Fund arrangements.
